


Monday Afternoon Book Group:

Linda Schuyler, Our Speaker for the September 25th General Meeting

As a young teacher in east-end Toronto, Linda Schuyler began creating short films with her classes, which led to her first very successful documentaries. This initial foray into film production brought about her founding of the popular television series, **The Kids of Degrassi Street**, and a tel-

evision franchise that spanned almost forty years. The Degrassi series launched the careers of many young Canadian actors, as well as addressing difficult issues that young people faced in their lives. In her 2023 memoir, **The Mother of All Degrassi: A Memoir**, Linda relates the inside story of her development of the Degrassi series, and why it was so important to her personally, as well as professionally. Born in London, England, Linda moved to Paris, Ontario with her parents, Jack and Joyce Bawcutt, who became leaders of the Paris community. Linda attended Paris High School before venturing to the big city for university. Linda has always maintained ties to the local community, and said she is very happy to speak to CFUW Brantford, and meet the members of the club. Linda will bring copies of her book for those who might like to purchase it after the meeting. We are honoured and excited to have Linda Schuyler as our speaker in September. Colette W.
